From the Collection

One of the many improvements made in our recent website upgrade is the increased accessibility of our historical photograph database. In prior versions of our site, our online photographs had to be accessed through external pages. The process has now been streamlined so that researchers and patrons can view the museum's photos right from our own site via desktop or mobile platforms.

To view these photographs, you can access the digital collection through the Collections & Research tab on the navigation bar of our website. From there, you can search specifically for an image or browse the catalog at your leisure. When accessing the collection via a desktop platform, you can browse the collection through smaller, more manageable subject collections. Use Boolean search operators to produce more relevant results (use of quotation marks or combining keywords with modifiers such as AND, NOT and OR) when looking for specific images. The museum has almost 7,000 photographs ready to view online, and more are being made available every day.

The museum has over 15,000 photographs in its collection, and the hope is to one day make each and every one of them digitally available to the public.
